April 2023

Lent is coming to an end and this year has been a time of reflection for us all. I am in my third month as Pastor of Record, things are going well. I am encouraged by your spirit and willingness to take risks and look ahead. It is a special gift to be able to see outside the bubble. The council has been a particularly positive force during this time of change and reflection, I want to commend them for their willingness to deal with such times in grace and courage.

The pastoral search continues, and the committee will be reactivating itself after Easter. It is my personal expectation we will begin to see some movement in the interviewing process. The Synod is doing the best it can and is working diligently to promote us, in the meantime we are called to be both patient and persistent!



Cheese Sausage Soufflé

6 eggs, well beaten
2 cups milk
1/2 teaspoon dry mustard
1/2 teaspoon salt
6 slices white bread, crusts removed and cubed
1 pound bulk sausage, cooked and drained
1 cup grated cheddar cheese
1. Mix first four ingredients and set aside.
2. Butter a 9 x 13 baking dish.
3. Combine egg and milk mixture with bread cubes and sausage. Pour into baking dish.
4. Top with grated cheese, and refrigerate 12 hours or overnight. Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes.

Youth/Christian Education/Preschool: Preschool Board met Feb 13: Playground to be installed next week. Becky Garrett is planning a fundraiser once the playground is here. The Preschool has already paid the church back over half of what was loaned! Also Becky wanted to increase the monthly amount to the church from \$300 to \$350, the Board agreed. Should see the change within the next month. Open House is Sunday, March 5 from 2-4 p.m. and Graduation is May 24 at 7 p.m.

Michael Wayne Smith

Michael is a Christian singer / songwriter from Oak Ridge, TN and has been traveling in ministry with his family since 2009 proclaiming the love of Christ through his music.

Before launching his own ministry, Michael wrote songs for other gospel artists. His song, My Home, is perhaps his most well known, becoming a #1 hit at many radio stations across the country.

When Michael released his first CD Welcome Home, the first radio single "Everything's Fine" became an instant hit and began opening doors for him and is still his most requested song to this day.

No, 10 years later, he is still going strong with no plans of slowing down. He has released a total of 7 studio album, 16 radio singles, a "Live" concert DVD and currently has 2 more projects in the works.

Michael grew up influenced by different styles of music, but his primary interest has always been southern / country gospel. This is evident when you hear his songs. Over the years, he has explored other Christian music genres, including praise and worship and traditional hymns.



In 2019, Michael started working on 2 new projects. One of them being his first ever Christmas album. The title of the album is appropriately titled Peace On Earth and was released in November 2019, followed by a 6 week tour of Christmas concerts.

Due to the recent pandemic, this other project was placed on hold but is expected to be released in the late October 2020. This new album will feature 11 new songs that will encourage and uplift.

When you hear his songs like "Everything's Fine", "Until The Storm Is Over", or "This Too Shall Pass", you know they are coming from the heart of someone who has experienced trials just like anyone else. These songs allow you to connect with him and help remind you that God is our refuge and we can turn to Him in difficult times and trust His divine plan for our life.

When you have Michael Wayne Smith in your church or concert event, you will experience music that not only lifts your spirit but will draw you into God's presence. His songs come from the heart and will find their way into yours!

Michael and Kelley have been married for 27 years and have two daughters. Kerri, the oldest, is an elementary school teacher and is also involved in her church's music ministry while Kasey is currently in college and is engaged to a young preacher from Maryland.
