Pastor's Message

August 2023 After our LSIM All Council retreat this past month, the call committee and council debriefed the call process. As you know, our candidate withdrew her name from consideration, which was both disappointing and surprising for all concerned. Regardless, we are ready for a reset and plan to move ahead having learned from our experience. Working with our LSIM partner, we will continue to cover the pulpit at GSLC, and I have contractually extended my time with you through Christmas Eve and arranged with Deacon Nancy and LSIM to cover several weeks between now and the end of the year to give me a "soft landing" back to full retirement as soon as a candidate can be interviewed and called. Deacon Nancy and I will continue to cover all pastoral care needs during this time (I am primary, she is my backup) and I will continue to work with Council, Committees and planning to move GSLC ahead as we continue our search for a full-time pastor.

I am excited for the Homecoming Weekend, The Car Show on Saturday is the first of many, I hope, and the Worship service on Sunday, a Festival of Hymns (our Chancel Choir is also singing that Sunday) will be followed by an outdoor fellowship that includes wood fired pizzas and live entertainment (by the Fourman Family) as well as displays throughout the building celebrating our 65 years. On August 13th we will have a third council listening post at 9:15 in the morning regarding Goal # 2, the addition of a second worship service. Remember, this is about our council listening, answering questions, and considering possibilities based upon the five-year plan you adopted last December. It only works if you show up! Next month, following a well-attended course on Lutheranism, I will provide a schedule for a couple of Fall Adult Bible Studies. My office hours will resume on Wednesdays, 10am – 2 pm. With mom's surgery they were hit and miss during June and July, but she is doing well, and I plan to keep that schedule for the remainder of this calendar year.

September 10 is ELCA "God's Work Our Hands" Sunday, a day annually set aside for ELCA congregations to do a service project to reach out in the name of Christ and serve our community. I propose we stay after church that day, enjoy a provided lunch and pack personal toiletry bags for our homeless friends at First Lutheran. I have secured funding for all materials needed through a Thrivent Team grant, so plan to stay that day, have lunch, and pack Personal Toiletry bags for those in need! Lots going on, keep the faith, it's worth keeping!

Air Quality - Why is it important?

Our air quality in the Dayton area has been affected by the wildfires in Canada. When the wind is from the North or Northwest, the wildfire smoke drifts over this region of the U.S. and greatly impacts our air quality. I went for a bike ride last week and when I returned, I had a stuffy nose and burning, watery eyes. It wasn't until later that I learned that the "Air Quality Index" was in the red, "Unhealthy" category. The weatherman said that all people should avoid outside activities, especially vigorous activities for long periods of time. Prior to this, I had heard mention of ozone layers being unhealthy but never had really learned about air quality and how to track it on a daily basis.

Since my bike ride, I have read and listened to some important tips on how to track air quality and what to do with the information once you find it. A great resource to find current air quality is www.airnow.gov. You put in your zip code and this is what you will see:

You can use this information to determine if you should be outside to work or play on any given day.





Exposure to particulate matter in the air can be dangerous even for people who don't have lung or breathing problems like asthma. Your risk can be reduced by following the guidelines in this infographic from the CDC and by being more intentional about your outdoor activities.
