Council Meeting Minutes

January 17, 2023

Present: Les Barker, Vice President; Pastor Craig Fourman; David Stein; Toby Theis; SuzieVagedes and Ric Warner, President

Meeting was called to order by Ric Warner.

Opening prayer was offered by Pastor Craig.

Secretary's Report: Minutes were approved as written. Motion: Toby Theis, Second: Les Barker. All were in favor.

Financial Secretary's Report: Motion to approve as written: Dave Stein, Second: Les Barker. All were in favor.

Treasurer's Report: Motion to approve: Toby Theis, Second: Dave Stein. All were in favor. **Pastor's Report:** No report

NEW BUSINESS:

<u>Council Nominees</u> – Ric will reach out to see if anyone is willing to serve prior to the congregational meeting.

<u>2023 Budget</u>- Ric Warner presented the 2023 budget and reviewed with Council members. After discussion it was agreed that the Catechism and Luth Youth should remain at \$250 and \$200, respectively, and that the Synod Assembly would be adjusted to \$200. Les Barker motioned to present the budget with changes as above to the congregation at the Congregational Meeting on Sunday, January 22. Dave Stein, seconded. All were in favor. Motion approved.

OLD BUSINESS:

<u>Proposed Fourman Contract</u>- Ric Warner discussed with Bob Abrams the contract for the establishment of Pastor Craig Fourman as part-time Interim Pastor. Bob stated that we needed to approve the contract through Council, but that it did not need to be voted on by the Congregation. Les Barker motioned to approve Pastor Fourman as Interim Pastor as stated in the contract. Second: Suzie Vagedes. All were in favor. Motion approved.

<u>5-Year Plan</u> –Ric is working on scheduling some seminars: CPR and AED certification through the parish nurse, Beth Ewing, and a basic computer class Amy Grile have been discussing the idea of a Reunion/Homecoming of Good Shepherd young adults. Thinking to include a meal and a time of fellowship, but also want to pick their brains about what they are looking for in a church and what GSLC could to do to get young families to come and come back to church. All were receptive to the idea and additional brainstorming included having it in the summer so we could be outside; having it in September and incorporating it into an Oktoberfest-type celebration.

<u>Pastor search</u> – Pastor Craig updated the council on the issues that are playing out at Synod level while we wait to hear news of any progress. Bob Abrams is looking at all the seminaries in the area now. Pastor Craig stated that Good Shepherd is positioned well to attract quality candidates and encouraged Council to continue to do what we're doing (work on implementing our 5-year plan) and try to be patient as we wait.

Worship: No report

Mission/Outreach/LSIM/MUCC: Becky Garrett is asking for help with dollar donations for Bulldog Bags. As food prices are rising, it is costing more to supply the weekend lunch food bags. Possible solutions: Thrivent grants, contact Clothesline for a donation to be matched by Thrivent.

Property: Les Barker reported that the parking lot lights will be replaced once he has bought, borrowed or rented a lift. Dave Stein is working on the down spout. Pastor Craig offered free filing cabinets; he was referred to JoAnn as she was needing some for her office.

Youth/Christian Education/Preschool: no report.

Stewardship: No report.

Fellowship: No report

Motion to Adjourn Council Meeting: Dave Stein, Second: Les Barker. All in favor.

Meeting adjourned with The Lord's Prayer.

Milton-Union Bulldog Bags is a program that assists the elementary school families in the Milton-Union School District. Families have the option to opt-in to our program each school year. Children who opt-in to the program receive a bag of food each week to take home that has supplemental food for over the weekend.

Milton-Union Bulldog Bags started in October 2016 with 30 students getting served each week. This school year, 2022-2023, we are serving 200 students each Friday. We have been truly blessed by our community with their overflowing generosity and prayers.

Each Thursday we have around 10 amazing adult volunteers come and set up our food. Once the food is set up a Freshmen Focus class from the high school comes down and packages our bags for us. A group of students then passes the bags out to the elementary rooms. The teachers give the students their bags on Friday mornings to take home for the weekend. This project has truly become a great service opportunity for so many students in our school district.

We are currently looking for donations to finish off the 2022-2023 school year and jump start us into the next school year. We are reaching out to the businesses and churches within our district to ask for help.
