Guiding Light Advocates Update

Hello! As promised for more transparency here is an update on GLA. Earlier this month we received a phone message from an expectant mom in need of help. The good news is we know our sign is working! However, after reaching out multiple times, I unfortunately was never able to get in contact with the caller. I can only pray that she will reach back out as her delivery date approaches and that she has chosen life for her baby.

This month GLA will be supplying a case of diapers and wipes to the family in need that we sponsored at Christmas. I know our ongoing support is needed and greatly appreciated.

Lastly, at a chance encounter I met a single father and his 3 year old daughter. Dad G is a 60 year old, retired vet and is raising his handicap daughter alone. Daughter J's mom surrendered her at birth due to her medical conditions and she relies solely on her father for her daily needs. Together they share a run down single bedroom apartment in Troy. J requires speech therapy, water therapy, occupational therapy and physical therapy. Dad G has spent his savings on a handicap accessible van and wheelchair. He is a disabled vet on a limited income and told me he spends much of his money on gas to get his daughter to all of her medical appointments. He expressed to me how difficult is it to put food on the table for the both of them near the end of the month. Their circumstance has weighed heavily on my heart and I hope to speak with Pastor about their situation in the near future.

An update on Kayleigh, the young mom living at Daybreak Shelter with her newborn son, Bryson. Kayleigh reports both of them are doing well, but as expected, she is very tired. Bryson is experiencing allergies and a stuffy nose each morning and his doctor recommended a humidifier to help him. GLA was able to provide the humidifier for mom and baby. ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING 2021

On Sunday, January 24, the Annual Congregational Meeting as held as is required by the church's constitution. There were 34 in attendance, which constituted a quorum, and there were several more members who were able to follow along with the meeting via our new YouTube live streaming capabilities.

Deacon Nancy Trimble opened the meeting with a prayer. Following the Call to Order, our Secretary Marsha Fischbach read the minutes from the last meeting which were then approved as read.

The first order of business was the presentation and approval of our 2021 operating budget. Ric Warner explained that, due to a reduction in our anticipated income for this year, the budget being presented was not balanced. Budgeted spending exceeds anticipated income. However, due to the fact that several line items in the budget in all likelihood will not be spent, our actual expenditures should match up with our anticipated income. The 2021 Budget was moved, seconded, and unanimously approved. The second agenda item was the election of Council members. Les Barker was nominated for a second term. Diana Frye, David Stein, and Judy Tipton were nominated as first-time council members. All were approved.

Finally, the addition of a Endowment Fund By-law to our Church Constitution was presented. This By-law was needed to provide a written outline of all aspects of fund management and operation. With sound fiscal management, the GSLC Endowment Fund will provide on-going benefits to our church for many years to come. A properly set-up and managed fund will also encourage other contributions when members realize that their gifts will support the church's work into the future.

After an explanation of the provisions of the By-law there was a short discussion and question period. Ballots were then distributed and the members in attendance voted. The results were 31 in favor of adopting the By-law, 0 opposed with one member abstaining. The meeting was then adjourned.
