Present: Ric Warner, Pastor Gellatly, Dianna Frye, Judy Tipton, David Stein, Les Barker, Susan Jebens, and Amy Grile. Marsha Fischbach joined the meeting on Zoom.

<u>Secretary's Report:</u> Approved as read. Motion: Pastor Steve Second: Judy Tipton All were in favor.

Financial Secretary's Report: Approved as read. Motion: Susan Jebens

Second: Dianna Frye All were in favor.

Treasurer's Report: Approved as read. Motion: David Stein Second: Les Barker

All were in favor. We received \$40,000 interest from the Endowment Fund at the Dayton Foundation. It was placed with Edward Jones. Electronic Funds Transfers are available with the Dayton Foundation.

Pastor's Report:

There will be a memorial service for Alene Oliver as part of our regular Pentecost service on Sunday, May 23. Tara Iddings, cellist, will play for the service. More news will follow concerning the arrangements.

Pastor Steve, BettyLou Johansen, and Marsha Fischbach will meet to finalize plans for our Easter Service.

New Business:

We welcomed new council members, Dianna Frye, Judy Tipton and David Stein. Lists of contact information for council members and committee assignments were handed out to each member. Marsha Fischbach asked when council members would be installed.

There is \$16,000 in interest earned from our Endowment Fund in 2019. Since there were no submissions from our congregation suggesting how we might use these funds, Council decided to gift these funds as follows. Motion: Les Barker Second: Dianna Frye Motion carried. The following six organizations will each receive \$2,000:

St. Jude's Childrens Hospital Shriner's Childrens, Dayton Children's Hospital, Cincinnati Salvation Army, Miami County Children's Hospital, Dayton Habitat, Miami/Shelby County

First Lutheran Church, Dayton, OH LSIM Seeds of Hope

Committee Reports:

Worship: Marsha Fischbach, Choir Director, reported that she will invite the Chancel Choir and the Shepherd's Bells to practice and play for our worship service on Easter. The choirs will participate as they are able after that. New members are always welcome.

<u>Mission/Outreach/LSIM</u>: The Senior Shepherds' are again sponsoring the Personal Care Kit Ministry during Lent. The Milton-Union Council of Churches will meet at Good Shepherd on March 29. Arlene Warner will no longer head our Lunch Bunch program.

<u>Property:</u> A television was mounted on the wall of the Community Room. The eventual goal is to be able to show the church service live in the Nursery and Community Room. A switch was installed where the baptismal font is plugged in. This will allow the fountain to be switched on and off rather than having to pull the plug.

<u>Youth/Christian Education</u>: Amy Grile will take charge of our Sunday School Program. <u>Stewardship</u>: No report

A motion to adjourn was made by Les Barker, and the meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.

SENIOR SHEPHERDS ANNUAL "PERSONAL CARE KIT" PROJECT

This is our 7th year to ask for your help in providing Personal Care Kits for those who are displaced as a result of natural disasters or other life changing experiences. This annual Lenten Project began in 2014. To date, we have provided 728 kits.

The kits contain a bath towel, toothbrush, nail clippers, comb, and soap. In the past, we have asked that you shop for these items and deliver them to church. This year, because of COVID restrictions, we are only asking for monetary donations. At a later date, we will shop for the items, prepare the kits, and deliver them to a location where they will be sent for distribution by Lutheran World Relief.

A monetary donation of \$10 will provide one kit. There will be a box in the Narthex for your donations. If you would like to mail your donation to the church, please note on the outside of the mailing envelope that it is for the Personal Care Kits or make a notation on your check. ENDOWMENT FUND GROWTH AT WORK

The recently approved Endowment Fund By-law provides for the withdrawal of 80% of the growth over basis in our Endowment Fund. In January 2020, Council approved the 80% of growth withdrawal and we received a check for \$21,000 from the Dayton Foundation. We donated \$5,000 to the Buckeye Backpack program when that program ran into serious financial difficulties. That donation allowed the program to continue its important work of feeding West Milton school children.

After the Buckeye Backpack donation, there was a carry-over from 2020 of close to \$16,000 in our Endowment Fund Growth account. At the February GSLC Council Meeting the Council voted to put that money to work. The Council approved donations to the following organizations for the amounts listed:

St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital, Memphis, TN \$2,000

Dayton Children's Hospital \$2,000

Shriner's Hospital for Children-Cincinnati \$2,000

Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center \$2,000

The Salvation Army-Miami County \$2,000

Habitat for Humanity - Miami and Shelby Cos. \$2,000

Seeds of Hope, Troy, OH \$1000

First Lutheran Church, Dayton \$1,000

Lutheran Saints in Ministry \$1,000

This month, we received a check for \$40,000 from the Dayton Foundation that represents the withdrawal of 80% of the growth from last year. Any GSLC member in good standing can submit an Endowment Consideration form if they have a worthy cause they would like to be considered for a donation. If you would like to suggest a donation, forms can be obtained by asking Pastor Steve, our secretary Breanna Ely, or any Council member.

Figuring out where to donate from the growth of our Endowment Fund is a marvelous problem to have. We need to count our blessings to be in such a position.

Sunday School Update

I hope this finds everyone well and in good spirits, with spring just around the corner. I am sending this to let everyone know Good Shepherd Sunday School is returning soon! This is no small undertaking given our ongoing struggle with getting and keeping youth participation and Covid concerns. These issues are what I am wanting to address as we look to restart classes.

First, due to the above issues, we will begin by having a "one room schoolhouse" during Sunday morning service. If numbers allow and restrictions ease we will then go back to classes by age group, before service. This will address the difficulties of trying to keep children socially distant, with masks for the duration of the church service. This brings us to...

Second, while in class, there won't be a requirement to wear masks or social distance. I want to be sure that all parents/care givers are fully aware of this. If your child has any medical concerns please do not send them. It is of the utmost importance to me that we do not put anyone in danger. Based on the current information being provided, children who are not immunocompromised are at very little risk of contracting or spreading the illness.

My third reason for this letter is to encourage everyone's input into what would make our Sunday School program effective, uplifting and successful. Current studies show that what a child has incorporated into their belief system by the age of 13, is predominantly what they will believe as adults. In a world where children are struggling with stress and depression at increasingly younger ages, it is critical to their wellbeing for them to have the security of a strong religious belief and loving church family.

Finally, please know that if you have concerns, I respect your view and support your choice to not participate. This is for those families that feel that this is a safe addition to their current interactions. Some families have seen emotional and behavioral distress in their children during this time of isolation. Our physical health is very important and as we have navigated through this pandemic, we have been made more aware of how our mental and spiritual health directly affect(s) our physical health. I am hoping the return of our program will give children a safe place to just be kids, learn of God's love and feel the love and support of our church family.

Thank you for your time in reading this. There will be more to come.
