CALL PROCESS DECEMBER REPORT

A big step in the call process was completed in November. After several rewrites, the Mission Site Profile (MSP) was approved by the GSLC Council on November 16 and submitted to the Synod.

We are the Mission Site so the Mission Site Profile is all about us — what is the community like, what is the congregation like, what are our goals, what challenges do we face, what are our finances like, what are we looking for in a new pastor, what do we want a new pastor to do for us and so forth. This is the document that the Synod makes available to potential pastor candidates as a brief introduction to our church. After reading our MSP, candidates decide if they want to move on to the next step — an interview with our Call Committee.

A special thank you to the individuals who have stepped up and volunteered to be on our Call Committee: Barbara Cecil, chairperson, Bob Spitler, Marsha Fischbach, Donna Plunkett, and Trevor Grile. Their primary responsibility will be to conduct the initial interviews with pastor candidates and make recommendations to Council.

The next step in the process is a training session for our Call Committee with Pastor Bob Abrams from the Synod. This should happen sometime in the first two weeks of December. Once that is completed, the Call Committee will be available to interview any candidates who may be interested in being the pastor of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church.




Caring is a gift no one can buy. It's made up of love that roots in our hearts & creates memories not just for a while but for a lifetime.....

2) Set aside a special time to read the Christmas story in



Good Shepherd member Victoria Hammermeister presented an idea for a community kid's club for Wednesday early evenings beginning in January. Council supports her idea and future information will be distributed in the community.

Motion: Les Barker Second: David Stein. All were in favor.

Devotions were led by Ric Warner.

Secretary's Report: Approved as read. Motion: Amy Grile Second: Diana Frye. All were in favor.

Financial Secretary's Report: Approved as read. Motion: Amy Grile Second: Les Barker. All were in favor.

Treasurer's Report: Approved with changes. Motion: David Stein Second: Marsha Fischbach. All were in favor.

Pastor's Report: Vandalia Saint Johns is joining LSIM. The LSIM retreat has been rescheduled for April of next year.

Administrative Assistant Report: - We received a letter from Workers Comp regarding reducing our payment. Order forms for Christmas Poinsettias will be out soon. Our Facebook page has 156 followers.

New Business:

An Endowment Consideration Form was received for a new kitchen floor.

We will let Thrivent Members know they can apply for a \$250 grant to benefit our different outreach ministries. Someone will help them fill out the request form.

Les Barker estimates the cost of approximately \$1895 to install a fence for a preschool play area. Our preschool is applying for a grant for equipment. Council approved using endowment money. Motion: Amy Grile Second: David Stein All were in favor.

Tulips Up, a new business in West Milton, will be supplying our altar flowers at a cost of \$22.50 each Sunday. This is the price we were paying Patterson's Flowers until they went out of business.

Old Business:

There will be a Call Committee meeting Thursday to complete the on-site form requested by the Synod to get our call process started.

Councill decided not to pursue the idea of sharing a pastor with Phillipsburg Emmanuel Lutheran Church. Counters are still needed to count the offerings each Sunday.

Reports:

Worship: Christmas choir practices are underway for our program on December 17. We have several people that joined the choir from other churches in the area.

Mission/Outreach/LSIM: We are collecting mac and cheese and grape jelly for the community Christmas baskets.

We are asked to donate 100 of each item.

We are hosting the helping hands food distribution program this year.

People are needed to ring the bell for the Salvation Army.

The Milton-Union Council of Churches will meet at Good Shepherd the fourth Monday in November.
