GUARD YOUR ATTITUDE

Max Lucado writes in Grace for the Moment the following devotion based on Thessalonians 2:6:

"Lord, don't you care that my sister has left me alone to do all the work?" (Luke 11:40). Martha's life was cluttered. She needed a break. "Martha, Martha, you are worried and upset about many things," the Master explained to her. "Only one thing is important. Mary has chosen (it)." (Luke 11: 41-42)

What had Mary chosen? She had chosen to sit at the feet of Christ. God is more pleased with the quiet attention of a sincere servant than the noisy service of a sour one...

What matters more than the type of service is the heart behind the service. A bad attitude spoils the gift we leave on the altar for God.

This is a time of change for Good Shepherd and service is needed from each and every one of you. From the oldest to the youngest. From those who hold leadership positions to those who labor silently in the background. We all need to see each other as the quiet servants, not the noisy sour ones. You are facing some small hurdles, none of which are insurmountable given your faith and dedication to God. Do not let uncertainties guide your lives and decisions. Be prayerful especially in these transitional times and approach each other in support and grace. Look to this passage as St. Paul writes to the Thessalonian church:

May our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father encourage you and strengthen you in every good thing you do and say. (2 Thessalonians 2:16)

I will continue to provide regular altar worship/preaching monthly until a new pastor has been called. Pastor Peter Kruse will assume the vice pastor role June 1 if approved by the synod.

At our LSIM board meeting on January 24, we became aware of many opportunities to support our shared mission. So, mark your calendars, and see if you have the gifts and time to serve.

The traditional (now after several years) Celtic (Irish) Service will be held after St. Patrick's Day. This year it will be on March 20 at 3:00 p.m. Musicians needed!

Plans for an Easter Vigil Service will be announced soon. It will be on Saturday evening, April 16. Again, special music will be requested.

LSIM, in cooperation with Emanuel Ministries, new owners of the St. Mark's building in Fairborn, will be holding a Southern Ohio Amazing Grace Day Camp in Fairborn from July 31 -August 5.
