Thank you for all who have supported Guiding Light Advocates this year. You haven't seen me for many weeks as my family and I have been very sick and are slowly working our way back to health. Despite not being present recently, this year was still a successful year for Guiding Light Advocates. Anytime we can assist a local mom or family in need we provide hope and companionship to a many times private, stressful and lonely journey. I have been able to deliver and drop off items needed for several moms in need this year. Without your help and donations I wouldn't be able to do this. Thank you so much for your generosity.

This year we have supplied diapers and wipes to several children in need. Guiding Light supplied clothing for 3 local children in need whose father was just placed in jail and their mom is left struggling to care for them with no financial assistance. I was able to drop off a crib along with baby accessories to a local family experiencing a financial hardship caused by Covid. They were unsure how they could care for baby #4 after unexpectedly losing their only source of employment.

This year we were also faced with the new challenge of helping a mother who ultimately lost custody of her daughter. Baby Ella was placed in foster care despite our efforts to help her mom change her ways. This was upsetting but ultimately the best thing for baby Ella. I want to thank all for their involvement, emotional support and for those who became invested in Ella's story. I wanted to let you know I was recently updated with pictures and want to share that she is healthy, growing and looks very content with her foster family. I pray that she will be adopted as reconciliation is unlikely at this time, and pray for stability and love in Ella's future.

I'm not sure what the future holds for Guiding Light next year. Many changes are on the horizon for my family and a move due to military orders may happen by summertime. Until then, I will try my best to help those I can. I welcome anyone who wants to join me on this mission to help those facing unexpected pregnancies and life challenges as parents.

GOOD SHEPHERD LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES

November 16, 2021 7:00 p.m.

Present: Amy Grile, Ric Warner, Les Barker, Susan Jebens, Deacon Nancy, David Stein, Judy Tipton, Diana Frye, and Marsha Fischbach

Deacon Nancy Trimble opened the meeting with prayer.

Devotions were led by Marsha Fischbach.

<u>Secretary's Report:</u> Approved as read. Motion: Susan Jebens Second: Amy Grile All were in favor.

<u>Financial Secretary's Report</u>: Approved as read. Motion: Judy Tipton Second: Deacon Nancy Trimble All were in favor.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Approved as read. Motion: David Stein Second: Les Barker All were in favor

Interim Pastor's Report:.

LSIM news: Sunset Cafe at St. Marks is doing only take-out. St Mark's building is being transferred to Emmanuel Ministries as of June 2022.

Deacon Nancy has to have surgery, but will not know the date until after Nov. 30. If the surgery comes before Christmas Eve, we will need to have a different pastor conduct the Christmas Eve service. Pastor Craig could fill in; but it would have to be a 5:00 service.

Administrative Assistant Report:

We are asking for help in finding a name for the youth ministry we are planning to begin in January on Wedesday evenings.

Amy Grile is still looking into hosting programs/classes available to the community. Our altar flowers have been okay.

The Milton-Union Council of churches is asking all churchs to prayerfully consider making a donation for medical expenses for Jessica Brown. She must reside out of state for her procedures for perhaps one to two years.

New Business:

Carol Garver, Director of the West Milton Senior Citizens' Center, has filled out an Endowment Fund Request for money for gliders and tables at the center. More information is needed. Our Council will add to the Endowment Fund Rules that those outside of our church family should have a church member sponsor the request.

A motion was made by Diana Frye, and seconded by Judy Tipton, that we pay off our mortgage with endowment fund interest money; and that such money each month would go toward a new pastor's salary. After much discussion, the motion was tabled. Motion to table: Susan Jebens Second: Amy Grile Motion carried.

The 2022 budget was reviewed by council, and will be presented to the congregation at the annual meeting in January.

Ric asked for approval of the Mission Site Profile that will be submitted to our synod to begin the call for a new pastor. Motion: Les Barker Second: Marsha Fischbach Motion carried.

Marsha Fischbach and Amy Grile will complete their terms on council in January. We need volunteers to run for these empty seats.

With much regret, council accepted the resignation of Betty Lou Johansen as church accompanist, effective November 30, 2021.

A motion was made to hire Darrell Fryman as a substitute accompanist at a rate of \$100 per Sunday worship service and choir practice, plus mileage. Motion: Marsha Fischbach Second: Judy Tipton All were in favor.

Marsha Fischbach motioned that we purchase a Hymn CD at a cost of \$70. Susan Jebens seconded the motion. All were in favor.

Old Business:

Kitchen Floor estimates have been received. Council members saw samples of flooring and chose one. Motion: Susan Jebens Second: Diana Frye. All were in favor.

A preschool meeting was held on Monday, November 8. Beckett Garrett, director, shared that the preschool will start paying the church \$300 a month for expenses. Becky is waiting on a quote from Rob Tebbe for the cost of installing a fence, which the church will pay for. The preschool is planning to pay for playground equipment. She is looking into fundraisers, Thrivent Grants, and possibly a donation from Lowe's for equipment or fence installation.

Committee Reports:

Worship: We are asking our members to light the candles in the Advent wreath each Sunday. Familes, Couples, and individuals are invited to participate. Christmas choir practice is going very well. We have several members of our community joining us this year. Since we do not have enough people to play in the full bell choir, we will have a quartet play this year for the program.

Mission/Outreach/LSIM: MUCC is packing the Christmas boxes here at Good Shepherd on December 9 this year. Distribution is on the 10th.

<u>Property:</u> The portico lights are now on a timer.

Youth/Christian Education: Our preschool is going great and has 24 children attending.

Stewardship:

Our next meeting will be Monday, Dec. 20. All council members should bring a dessert.

A motion to adjourn was made by Diana Frye, and the meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.
