Pastor's Message

Grace and Peace to you from God our Father and Jesus Christ our Savior! As you read this, we have passed the Transfiguration of Christ and begin the journey of Lent. I pray you will consider during this Lenten journey, where Christ dwells in your life. Is he an add on when things get tough? Is he somewhere south of your treasure and your heart? Senior Shepherds and Friends are back again after a second COVID shut down!

The planning group met on February 22 to start over, with lots of ideas from past planning.

Programs at this date are not confirmed, but will be announced in Sunday bulletins and in future newsletters.

The programs selected include "Bees and The Honey They Produce," (which is scheduled for March 22; see details on page 4) "Local Police Efforts in Our Age," "Ecumenical Church Relationships," and "Dayton's Inventors." We may also sponsor a "field trip" to a local distillery in May.

Discussion about the Personal Care Kits to which we have contributed in Lenten seasons during past years was suggested as a fall project this year. Our "collection and packing time" will then be closer to the time they are delivered to the truck in Dayton.

This year, our Lenten project will be the collection of "Good Used Clothing." Once in the past we invited the community of West Milton to join us in sharing used clothing with people in need in downtown Dayton. First Lutheran Church will be our primary distribution location. Several years ago we had a successful event like this for the "God's Work, Our Hands" Sunday.

We will announce our program during Lent and hold the actual collection day on Sunday, April 3. Community members may "drive through" on Sunday, April 3, and congregational members may bring their clothing contributions to worship that morning. On that Sunday afternoon we would like volunteers to help carry donations into the church from the community members who arrive between noon and 3 p.m.

Congregational Meeting Summary

The congregation met on January 23 for our annual Congregational Meeting. After an opening prayer by Pastor John Johansen the minutes from the last congregational meeting were read and accepted. Then, the proposed 2022 Operating Budget was presented, discussed, and approved. Copies of the approved budget are available in the Annual Report or by contacting Amy Grile at the church office.

The next agenda item was the election of Council members. There were three openings on Council this year. Amy Grile and Marsha Fischbach were leaving Council due to the completion of their second three-year term. We want to thank them both for dedicated and faithful service. Judy Tipton also asked to be relieved of her Council duties. We were only able to fill two of those vacancies so far with the election of Suzie Vagedes and Toby Theis. If you are able and willing to serve, please let Ric Warner or Amy know.

The final agenda item was a presentation and discussion of our call process options. After much discussion, the congregation overwhelmingly voiced support for the option of pursuing a full-time pastor as opposed to a part-time pastor or a sharing arrangement with another church.

After the meeting, when the results of the call process discussion were communicated to the Synod, we were told that the they would begin immediately to look for candidates for us to interview. That was

really good news because, up until now, the Synod has been reluctant to send anyone our way. We are now in a position to start moving forward again.
