Pastor's Message

Dear Friends in Christ,

It is that time again to consider our support of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church and her ministries. Consider Psalm 50: 1-15 as you prayerfully consider what God has blessed you with and what first fruits you will give this year. Many of us give the leftovers after we pay our bills and buy what we desire. God has given you everything without cost. This year you face the call of a new pastor. Will you give such that you can call someone to partner with you in growing Good Shepherd? Please consider that in your prayers for guidance to giving. Consider the following devotion.

God Owns it All Scripture Reading — Psalm 50:1-15

"If I were hungry I would not tell you, for the world is mine, and all that is in it." — Psalm 50:12 —

In a message on stewardship, a pastor recently encouraged us to go home, look around, and give thanks for what we have.

He wanted us to give thanks to God for letting us live in homes that belong to him and for allowing us to drive cars that really are his. He wanted us to thank God for our paychecks, our businesses, our jobs, our savings, and our investments. He wanted us to acknowledge God as the owner of all things.

That's the teaching of Psalm 50, that God is the absolute owner of everything we have. "The world is mine, and all that is in it," says the Lord. God owns "the cattle on a thousand hills." He is the owner of absolutely everything we have. We are no more than managers. As one author put it, "God never turned the deed or title over to us."

Take a few moments today to look at everything you have. Take out your checkbooks and your bank statements, and ask yourself: Am I living as someone who knows he is not the owner? Do I use my resources to build God's kingdom and to help those in need?

Remember the words of Jesus: "Seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well" (Matthew 6:33).

Ask him to help you be a faithful steward. Prayer: Lord, thank you for allowing us the use of so many things. Help us to be faithful as we manage the things you own. In Jesus' name, Amen.

<u>Community Gem:</u> <u>Becky Garrett of West Milton helps children in need</u>

WEST MILTON - If there's a need for something for the kids in West Milton, it's a good bet Becky Garrett will be nearby. "She is very active in the community when there is a need. She gets along with everyone. She has a very caring heart," wrote Les Trittschuh of West Milton, who nominated Garrett as a Dayton Daily News Community Gem.

Garrett was surprised by her nomination but not by the person responsible. "He is very involved in the community also. He and I work a lot together," she said.

The children's ministry director at her church, Hoffman United Methodist in West Milton, Garrett also is director of the Good Shepherd Lutheran pre-school in West Milton. She organizes "Bulldog Bags," a nonprofit organization that provides food for the weekends for Milton-Union students. She heads up "Lunch Bunch" that feeds the children during the summer and is the director of Junior Teen Institute.

Trittschuh said a few words can best describe Garrett: "She is a super Community Gem!"

Call Process – November Report

The call process is going well. It never goes as quickly as you would like it to, but we are making steady progress. We have established a Call Committee. The group consists of Bob Spitler, Marsha Fischbach, Trevor Grile, and Donna Plunkett with Barb Cecil chairing the group. I want to thank each of them for stepping up for this important task.

I reported last month that the first step in the process was a meeting between our Church Council and the Synod Bishop and her assistant. In October, we have been working on completing the Mission Site Profile, or MSP, for the Synod. We are the Mission Site so the MSP is all about us – what is the community like, what is the congregation like, what are our goals, what challenges do we face, what are our finances like, what are we looking for in a new pastor and on and on. Our MSP currently stands at 12 pages and I want to thank the Call Committee for their valuable work and input on this project.

Once the MSP is submitted and approved by the Synod it will be sent out by them to pastorcandidates as a preliminary introduction to our church. The candidates, after reading our MSP, decide whether he or she wants to set up an interview to come talk to us. I am pleased to report to you all that our MSP is completed and should be submitted the first week of November.



This time of year is always Stewardship campaign time. Estimate of Giving cards and a cover letter have been or are in the process of being distributed. We are asking that you complete your card and have it back to us by November 14.

You might be wondering what to base your giving decisions on. Well, so is the church leadership. Until we have a pastor candidate, and experience has told us that could be a long time or next month, we will have no clear knowledge of what offering amounts we are going to need. The Synod has told us that the probability of finding a part-time pastor is very low. There just aren't any part-time pastors available. That means we will be talking to full-time candidates who will need full-time compensation. Again, according to the Synod, full-time compensation could be somewhere in the range of \$90,000 to \$100,000 which is considerably more than is in our current budget.

We will be having a more traditional Stewardship campaign when we have a better handle on what our financial needs are going to be. It goes without saying that at that time we are all going to have to do a lot of financial soul-searching on what we want the future of this church to be and hard decisions will need to be made.

Going into 2022, our budget, with some minor tweaks, is going to look very much like this year's budget. For that reason, at this time, we are asking that you simply continue your 2021 giving into this coming year. Of course, any increase in your Estimate of Giving would be welcome and will allow us to accumulate funds in anticipation of our future stewardship needs.

Devotions for Congregations in Call Process

Devotion 2 of a 5 part series by the Rev. Ronald Olson

II. In Calling a Pastor, We Consider God's Gifts

God's gracious giving extends to the church, too. God has not been content to let the church fend for itself since Pentecost. On the contrary, the Holy Spirit still enlivens the community of faith. As Bishop April Ulring Larson has said, "What God is interested in is empowering the body of Christ." God has raised up leaders, gifted ministers and pastors for the church in all times and places. When the church has prayed, "Save and defend your whole Church, purchased with the precious blood of Christ. Give it pastors and ministers filled with your Spirit, and strengthen it through the Word and the holy sacraments," God has answered.

Listen to this wonderful scripture: Il Peter 1:3-11. Would any of us, either as individual believers or as members together of a congregation, have any reason to question the truth of those verses? In fact, how have the promises offered there been answered and proved true in your experiences of the life of faith? In the life of our congregation?

We overhear the prayer that scripture offers up for us in Ephesians 3:14-21. The One who has called us is also at work in us doing far more than we can ask or imagine. That's an amazing thought!

As we join in singing or saying LBW 543, "Praise to the Lord, the Almighty," focus on verse two and ask, "What does that verse mean, promise, and say to us about God's watch over us?" Can we claim this hymn's great promise even in calling a new pastor?

Luther's Small Catechism offers his explanation of the third and fourth petitions of the Lord's Prayer saying: "God's will is done when he strengthens our faith and keeps us firm in his Word as long as we live."

And, "Daily bread includes everything needed for this life, such as food and clothing, home and property, work and income, a devoted family, an orderly community, good government, favorable weather, peace and health, a good name, and true friends and neighbors."

We daily trust God's good gifts for our faith and life. Such confidence also belongs to the faith and life of the whole church.

Gracious giving God, give us your help again, just as you have always done. Remind us of your care. Let there be gratitude in our congregation, for all that is needful has been sent and ordained for us already. As we work to call a new pastor to our congregation, may we be strengthened for this task with the thought that your providing reaches to every need of your church. This call committee and community of believers are your church, too. Amen.
